



Dedication ceremony held as restoration project completed

The Old Soldiers Ground Restoration Project held its dedication ceremony on Memorial Day, Monday, May 30 at 2 pm.

The Richland County Veterans Service Commission, in conjunction with the Mansfield Cemetery and Purdy Construction, has been working on this important project since October of 2019.

To make the area look uniform, they poured new foundations for all the graves. Ken Estep, Executive Director of the Richland County Veterans Service, welcomed the crowd.

In 2009, a World War II Veteran's granddaughter, Sue Dell, noticed there was no headstone on her grandfather's grave. She contacted the Veterans Service Commission, and they began to research her grandfather's papers and death certificate.

After the research, they discovered that her grandfather was a purple heart veteran and had been buried for 44 years without a headstone! When his headstone arrived and finally was placed on his grave, it became obvious there were many more unmarked graves just like his.

More research went on including studying maps, using burial lists and walking each row in the Old Soldiers Ground marking who did and did not have a headstone.

Dell felt that each deserved to be honored for their service and great sacrifice to our great country.

Ten years later, with the help of Ken Estep, Director of the Veterans Service Commission, the Veterans Service Board, the Mansfield Cemetery, Purdy Construction, and the Richland County Commissioners, they were able to begin this project! Righting this wrong that goes all the way back to the Civil War has been a rewarding endeavor. It was discovered that there was a total of 148 veterans without headstones.

During the renovation of the Veterans Honor Grounds in Mansfield Cemetery, Sue discussed with Stanton Grubb of Vets USA about the Old Soldiers Ground.

He sadly passed away before he could physically help. There is a special stone on the grounds dedicated to the memory of Stanton E. Grubb (1975-2017).

It reads, "A patriot who worked tirelessly on our Veterans Honor Grounds Restoration Project and was looking forward to working on this Old Soldiers Grounds Project. Thank you, Stanton, you will always be remembered with a smile. Dedicated on May 21, 2022."

Top Gun is one of the iconic films of the 1980s. Upon re-watch, it still holds up to 80s fun and a good movie. Hearing of an upcoming sequel *Top Gun: Maverick*, did not bring much excitement because the original felt like a contained movie and story and it's not one of those movies that audiences seem to be clamoring to see more of. Upon release, the early reviews came out and they were raving. I went into the movie thinking about its great reviews, but was not expecting to like it all so much.



Well, *Top Gun: Maverick* turned out to be a terrific movie going experience. It surpasses the original and action sequences, character development and overall plot are so engaging and exciting, it's really a shame it took so long.

Tom Cruise returns to his role as Maverick, now a teacher at Top Gun under the eye of Iceman (Val Kilmer). A case of nuclear material needs to be destroyed and is hidden in a curvy, dangerous mountain range. Cruise must teach a group of new Top Gun students how to survive and maneuver through this dangerous mission.

This is a terrific movie. Cruise explores so much depth in this character as he reunites with an

old friend (Jennifer Connelly) who becomes a romantic interest and butts heads with the son of the late Goose named Rooster (a very good Miles Teller).

The flight sequences have only gotten better as technology and filmmaking has improved. The last half of this movie is hold-on-to-your-seat entertaining and you walk out of the movie feeling so good and energized. Few movies can do that.

Everything filmed from the cockpit is so neat and Cruise is engaging, energetic and tender in the moments he needs to be. His performance in the original was almost a cocky young man who wanted to be the best and it's great to see how much this character has evolved and what they have done with him.

There is a reason that Tom Cruise wanted to wait until movie theaters were open to release this movie and of this writing it is Cruise's biggest opening weekend with over 95% audience and critic scores. Go see this movie on the biggest screen you can with a large popcorn. It's the reason we go to the movies.
